8. In Dryden's *An Essay of Dramatic Poesy*, how does Lisideius define drama?

12. Discuss Johnson's remarks on the mixture of tragedy and comedy in *Shakespeare*. In what ways does his view reflect or challenge neoclassical taste?
13. Examine Coleridge's response to Wordsworth's assertion that there is no essential difference between prose and poetry. How does Coleridge redefine poetic language through his theory of meter?
14. Discuss the arguments put forward by Crites in favour of the Ancients.
15. In Book 3 of Plato's *Republic* Socrates's educational programme is not to appreciate art for its own sake, but to shape the souls of the guardians, ensuring they are mentally and physically prepared to protect the ideal State. Do you agree? Give a reasoned answer.
