PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Williamnagar Government College (previously known as Williamnagar College) was started in 2000, out of the acute necessity of a good educational institution for higher education within the reach of the common people in East Garo Hills, by the combined effort of the public, senior citizens, NGOs and student leaders. A Governing Body consisting of members along with the principal and eight Teachers helped it run till 2009 which was later taken over by the government on the 18th February, 2009.

The main objective of the institution is to provide all aspiring students opportunities to pursue quality education and learn to become responsible and productive citizens.

The College is located at the centre of Williamnagar town. The College building comprises Old Assam Type and New multi-storied RCC building consisting administrative unit, Library, Classrooms, Students' Common Room, Teachers' Common Room and all other auxiliary units of the college.

The College is currently affiliated to the North Eastern Hill University (NEHU), Shillong. Any change in affiliation matters shall be informed to the students and stakeholders through Notice Board and College website.

The College is accredited by NAAC with Grade C at CGPA 1.81 in its 1st cycle declared on 14 September 2023.

IGNOU (Indira Gandhi National Open University) Study Centre has been operating in the College for courses in the Distance and Correspondence mode at Undergraduate and Postgraduate level.

Currently the College has been provided with examination centres for Undergraduate Arts course under NEHU and courses under IGNOU.

COURSES OF STUDIES

The College has already implemented Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) Four Year Under Graduate Program (FYUGP) based on National Policy of Education 2020 (NEP2020) guidelines under the directives of North Eastern Hill University (NEHU) Shillong from the academic session 2023-24. The duration of this course is four years spread over eight semesters having flexibility of multiple entry and exit based on centralised system of Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) with online DigiLocker facility. Each student is now required to register on ABC and have personal DigiLocker account to avail full benefit of the new system of education. Admission shall be based on the merit/performance of each candidate at Common University Entrance Test (CUET) held at national level. The College implements all the rules, procedures, and system pertaining to the admission, course of studies, examination, assessment, and scoring as per directives of the affiliating university, University Grants Commission (UGC) and the government.

All the candidates seeking admission are required to study thoroughly and understand the rules, procedure, and system of the new course of study (FYUGP) and agree to comply with the requirement. The details of each course of study along with course objectives, and combinations available can be accessed on the website of the College and the NEHU.

FYUG BACHELOR OF ARTS (MAJOR)

The total duration of the B.A. Course (FYUGP) is four years spread over to eight semesters. A semester comprises a half-yearly programme or term of studies.

Students are required to make a choice of MAJOR subject corresponding to other alternatives available from MINOR course, Multi-Disciplinary Course, Ability Enhancement Course, Skill Enhancement Course, and Value-Added Course.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

- i. Candidates desirous to get admission into the course of B.A. (FYUGP) are required to qualify in Common University Entrance Test (CUET) or fulfill admission criteria set by the affiliating University - NEHU.
- ii. Candidates who have passed +2 (Higher Secondary) course in their respective stream or an equivalent examination from a recognized board in India or abroad which is recognized by affiliating University or University Grants Commission shall be eligible for appearing in CUET.
- iii. Admission to the course shall strictly depend on the merit, and availability of seats, and merely qualifying in CUET or issue/purchase of Application Form and Prospectus do not entitle a candidate to get admission in any of the course in the College. Applicants exceeding the maximum seat capacity shall be rejected and no further request shall be entertained.
- iv. Reservation Policy of Government of Meghalaya for admission as followed by other government colleges of the state shall apply.
- v. Candidates who have passed +2 (Higher Secondary) or an equivalent examination in any stream recognized as above has the option to change/come over to Arts stream following procedure mentioned above.
- vi. The course stated above is offered only on regular mode and students required to attend daily classes and other curricular and co-curricular activities including continuous internal evaluation.
- vii. Each student is required to maintain 75% of attendance in classes and other academic activities to be eligible to appear in semester end examinations.

REGISTRATION

Students shall have to register themselves in Academic Bank of Credit online and have individual ID / account with Digi Locker facility besides requiring to register under the affiliating university within one semester of their enrolment.

CONDUCT OF EXAMINATION:

- ◆ The Course runs on the Semester System of Examination in which a semester occupies six months' duration or term of studies and therefore a total of eight semesters makes the course complete.
- ◆ The First, Third, Fifth and Seventh Semesters are known as odd semesters, while the Second, Fourth, and Sixth Semesters are known as even semesters.
- ◆ Internal Tests, Assignments / Projects (Continuous Internal Evaluation) and Semester-end Examinations form integral part of the evaluation system and are conducted in strict adherence to the guidelines of affiliating university.
- ◆ Students shall be allowed to proceed to the next semester irrespective of failed papers / arrear papers subject to payment of fees and fulfilment of other prescribed conditions laid down by the university.
- ◆ The weightage assigned to the Continuous Internal Evaluation and Semester End examinations shall be in the ratio 1:3
- ◆ For a 100 marks paper (4 credits), 25 marks will be assigned for Internal and 75 marks for end semester examination.
- ◆ For a 75 marks paper (3 credits), 19 marks will be assigned for Internal and 56 marks for the end semester examination.
- ◆ For a 50 marks paper (2 credits), 12.5 marks will be assigned for Internal and 37.5 Marks for the end semester examination.

LIBRARY

The college is equipped with a separate library which aims at providing best academic assistance to the student community of the college. The library as on date, holds 13279 volumes of books, besides subscribing to a number of magazines on general knowledge, career avenues, employment opportunities and competitive examinations. The college has been subscribing to more than a dozen Journals on different subjects and also a few Newspapers. Students are also provided with computers which have internet facilities that enable them to search reading materials related with their course of studies. Students, teachers and staffs have open access to the resources of the library.

GENERAL NORMS OF THE COLLEGE

- ☛ Students are required to attend a minimum of 75% of the total classes taken during an academic year/session, failing which they forfeit the chance to appear in the final examination of the college.
- ☛ Students must not be absent from class or any other important programme organized intended for their welfare without valid reasons. A leave of absence countersigned by parents/guardians must be produced on the first day of his/her return.
- ☛ Identity card will be issued to each student and should be brought to the college daily.
- ☛ Mobile phones are not to be used within and outside the class room.
- ☛ Students should not litter the compound with chewing gum, chips packets or unused papers and plastics. Empty plastic bottles and any unused items should be thrown in the garbage bin or basket kept for the purpose.
- ☛ Smoking, drinking / consumption of alcohol and drugs are strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- ☛ Ragging is a punishable crime. Any student / group of students caught indulging in ragging or intimidation of any sort will be expelled forth with. As per U.G.C. Rules every student is now required to register themselves online with anti-ragging commitment.
- ☛ Communal harmony is to be preserved and fostered by words and deeds. Students found engaging in activities which are detrimental to college shall be liable for immediate expulsion from the college.
- ☛ All the above rules are binding and anyone found violating any of these rules, appropriate action will be taken against him / her.

DRESS CODE

ADMISSION PROCESS

- ★ Application form, complete in all respect along with all relevant documents (Mark sheet, Certificate, etc. / as mentioned in the Application Form) must be submitted in person to the office of the Principal, Williamnagar Govt. College, Williamnagar within the stipulated time and date.
- ★ Candidates will be required to produce Original Mark sheet (s), Certificate (s) and other relevant document (s) at the time of Selection/verification and Interview for admission.
- ★ Application Form that is incomplete & submitted after the last date will be rejected.

Applicants are required to visit College website and/the College Notice Board (Offline) time to time for further Instruction on Admission and follow up accordingly. The College shall not be responsible if any applicant misses the Information/fail to turn up or delay due to personal reasons.
